September Message from Fr. John McLaughlin

Brother Knights: For us in New England, September brings the Feast of the Holy Cross, September 14. Our Cathedral is dedicated to the Holy Cross of Jesus, and our oldest Catholic College is that of the Holy Cross. Before the Pilgrims came to Plymouth in 1620, Samuel de Champlain had dedicated this coast of New England to Christ, and named our area La Terre de la Sainte Croix, the Land of the Holy Cross. The Emperor Constantine read these words in the sky, "In this sign (of the cross) you shall conquer." His mother, St. Helen, is venerated as the one who found the True Cross at Jerusalem in 325 A.D. Let us often make the Sign of the Cross over ourselves and on the foreheads of our children and our children's children. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen. Even the first canonized saint of the Americas, Rose of Lima, said, "Apart from the Cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven." May our Brother Knights love the Holy Cross! Amen

Welcome Fr. Bryan Parrish and Fr. Joseph Kim

Please join me in welcoming Father Bryan Parrish as Pastor of St. Joseph Parish and Father Joseph Kim as our new Parochial Vicar. Father Parrish served as the Episcopal Vicar for Clergy which he had done with distinction for the past five years. Before that he worked in the Vicar General's Office as Assistant to the Vicar General. A native of Canton and ordained to the Priesthood in 1988, Fr. Parrish served previously as Pastor of Holy Family Parish in Duxbury and Parochial Vicar at St. Mary Parish in Plymouth, St. Paul Parish in Wellesley and St. Mary Parish in Quincy. He has also assisted the Cardinal with a number of

leadership positions within the Archdiocese: a member of the Presbyteral Council, College of Consultors and the Clergy Personnel Board. He has also represented the Cardinal on the Board of the Clergy Health and Retirement Trust.

Father Joseph Kim who was ordained to the priesthood on May 19, 2018 in the Basilica and Shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (Boston). He began to ponder a vocation to the priesthood during his early to mid-20s when he rediscovered his faith in the Catholic Church. As he asked and reflected on deeper questions about life and faith, he was invited to assist in teaching religious education in his home parish. It was through the backdrop of the parish community that he began to understand the faith while being nourished through the Sacraments leading him to greater communion with God. Father Joseph currently serves as Parochial Vicar of Divine Mercy Parish in Sacred Heart, St. Ann's, and St. Mary's (Quincy) which he has done for the past two years as his first assignment.

Knights of Columbus Founder Father Michael McGivney Moves Closer to Sainthood

The Vatican announced on May 27th that Pope Francis approved the promulgation of a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of the founder of the Knights of Columbus, Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, a Connecticut priest who served his flock during the pandemic of 1890, before himself becoming ill and dying of pneumonia.

The pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared "Blessed," the step just prior to sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint.

The miracle recognized as coming through Father McGivney's intercession involved an unborn child in the United States who in 2015 was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition after prayers by his family to Father McGivney.

Father McGivney spent his entire priesthood in parish ministry and died of pneumonia on August 14, 1890— two days after his 38th birthday – after falling ill amid a pandemic. Recent scientific evidence indicates that that pandemic – like the current one – may have been caused by a coronavirus.

A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in Connecticut. It will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title "Blessed" on Father McGivney.
